

Impact of past pupil premium spend on outcomes:

Inspection Dashboard 2014 (released September 2015) highlights the following strengths:

**Key Stage 1 pupils** entitled to pupil premium funding ‘had an average point score equal to or above the national score for other pupils in writing and mathematics’ In addition, ‘the proportion that attained at least level 2B was equal to or above the national average for other pupils in reading, writing and maths.’

The proportion of **Key Stage 2 pupils** entitled to pupil premium funding ‘that attained Level 4 was equal to or above the national figure for other pupils in writing,’ The proportion ‘that attained at least Level 5 was equal to or above the national figure for other pupils in mathematics.’

Early analysis of data for 2015 indicates that the gap in attainment between children entitled to pupil premium funding continues to be narrow at both KS1 and KS2. The biggest gap is in writing at KS2 and in maths at KS1.

Children entitled to pupil premium funding make similar progress to other pupils in the school.
