

Khalsa Primary School Pupil Premium Grant Expenditure 2016-17

The government allocates an amount of money to each school that is in addition to main school funding. This money is called the Pupil Premium Grant (PPG). Schools are free to spend the PPG as they see fit. They are, however, accountable for how they have used the funding to support students eligible for pupil premium funding.

At Khalsa Primary School we have allocated expenditure based on evidence from the Sutton Trust and our own assessments.

Summary of PPG Spending 2016-17

Objectives in spending PPG:

- Diminish the difference (close the gap) between PP students and non-PP students in English and Maths and Reading.
- Ensure that all PP students have access to enrichment activities.
- Ensure that PP students receive intervention programmes.

Expenditure of Pupil Premium Grant 2015-16

Our PPG goes towards funding the following additional initiatives which aim to ensure that all of our pupils who are vulnerable to underachievement make accelerated rates of progress.

Objective 1: To diminish the difference in reading ability between pupils eligible for Pupil Premium and their peers. Teaching Assistant to run small group reading interventions. Teaching Assistant for 1 to 1 reading. Additional support in Early Years Foundation Stage to develop speech and language and reading.

Objective 2: To diminish the difference in writing between pupils eligible for Pupil Premium and their peers. Teachers and teaching assistant to run small group writing interventions

£12,000

Objective 3: To diminish the difference in maths between pupils eligible for Pupil Premium and their peers.
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£12,000

Objective 4: To extend the learning of more able pupils who are eligible for Pupil Premium. Additional staff to stretch the more able pupils. Additional Teaching Assistant support to support learning during lessons.
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£4,000

Objective 5: To enhance additional extra-curricular opportunities for pupils eligible for Pupil Premium. Support for pupils attending Y6 residential trip.
