









# KHALSA PRIMARY SCHOOL










- 94% of parents Agree and Strongly agree
- · Pupils surveys are conducted every year.
- Every morning pupils are able to share their feelings through using the Zones of Regulation.
- We have ELSA available (emotional literacy support) for pupils who have experienced a loss or change or need support with their emotional needs.
- We also have an external provider who works with pupils who have experienced loss, change or any trauma related events in their life.
- We use a 'worry box' in each class should a child want to disclose something discreetly.


- 97% of parents Agree and Strongly agree
- Key members of staff are allocated before and after duties at all entrance and exit points.
- All staff members have regular Safeguarding training both online and in person.
- We go above the recommended ratio for pupils to staff during lunch and break times.
- Each class has a worry box and can express their concerns discreetly if needed.
- Risk assessments and polices are regularly updated.
- We hold whole school assemblies on safeguarding.


- 87% Agree and Strongly agree
- There is an updated Behaviour Policy in place for this Academic Year.
- A consequence ladder has also been introduced this academic year. Staff have received training on this and it has also been shared with the pupils.
- An assembly focussing on each value is delivered to pupils in a Monday whole school assembly.
- All serious behaviour concerns are logged on an online platform.
- Whole school House Point System has been introduced.



At Khalsa Primary School our vision is to develop our pupils to be exemplary citizens who have a deep desire to make a positive contribution to our world.








- 82% of parents agree, strongly agree or don't know.

- We recognise and reward acts of kindness both in the class and whole school assemblies.


- 87% of parents agree and strongly agree

- All overviews are shared under curriculum on the school website.


- 94% of parents agree, strongly agree or don't know.

- Parents can also email concerns directly to the school. We will respond to any complaints within 24 hours.



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






- All staff have received regular training on how to support pupils with SEN.
- Classwork is adapted for pupils with needs.
- We have access SEBDOS support and Early help.
- We have an online platform called provision maps which captures all of our interventions, needs and individual plans.

- 91% of parents Agree or Strongly agree that their children do well at school.
- At the end of KS2 pupils attainment and progress was significantly above local and national average.
- Most pupils are on track to pass their phonics assessments.
- Our vision and values are centred around having high expectations for all of our pupils no matter what their starting points.
